INSTITUTO FRANKLIN-UAH

The Instituto Franklin-UAH is a center belonging to the Universidad de Alcalá, founded in 1987 to promote research on North America. It is the only University Research Institute on the United States in Spain and is funded through its doctoral programs, postgraduate studies, and specialized courses.

The Instituto Franklin-UAH focuses on developing new avenues of institutional collaboration between Spain and North America through specific initiatives primarily based on funding research projects, organizing international meetings and conferences, and developing academic programs for international students.

MISSION

The mission of the Instituto Franklin-UAH is to serve as a platform for communication, cooperation and union between Spain and North America, in order to promote mutual understanding.





HISTORY

1987 The President of the Universidad de Alcalá, Mr. Manuel Gala, founded the Centro de Estudios Norteamericanos (CENUAH).

2001 It became the Instituto Universitario de Estudios Norteamericanos, which represented both a recognition of the research conducted and a boost to the implementation of projects of major importance.

The Institute included the name of Benjamin Franklin to its previous name.

2011 It established its Advisory Board.

2012 The Camino Real Award was established.

GOALS

To provide a forum for the analysis and dissemination of issues related to North America, especially on the United States, with an academic and social outreach.

To enhance cooperation with different North American institutions in different fields of knowledge, with particular attention to relationships with the Hispanic community in the United States.

To contribute to scientific progress by allocating funds for research projects and the training of new researchers.

To train researchers to develop their professional skills within a framework of academic excellence.

THE CAMINO REAL AWARD

The name Camino Real refers to the pathways used by Spaniards to reach the territories that are now part of the United States.

In the late 19th century, with California already a state in the Union, some sections of this Camino Real were marked by bells. Currently, there are 450 bells placed along the historic Camino Real of California.

The sculpture of the bell is designed by the Navarran sculptor Carlos Ciriza.
