# **INTERNATIONAL STUDIES PROGRAM**

The International Studies Program is a short- term undergraduate program offered by the Consortium for Transatlantic Studies and Scholarship (CTSS) in collaboration with Instituto Franklin-UAH. Courses are solely instructed in English and offered in the Spring Semester.

# MISSION

# PARTICIPANTS

The program is offered to both undergraduate students and participating faculty. Faculty may propose their course to teach for CTSS. Universities do not need to send faculty for students to participate.

# MISSION

Three blocks of 1 month each. Students choose 1 course per block. Intensive format of 45 hours" (3 U.S. credits). All students will be enrolled in an "Introduction to Spain" course. Students earn 12 credits total.
