MISSION

To encourage and promote specialized research and multicultural discussion from a transatlantic point of view.

PERSPECTIVE

The program has a comprehensive international nature, involving professors and students from different universities around the world.

PARTICIPANTS

Undergraduate students from diverse disciplines and majors.

STRUCTURE

Three blocks of 1 month each. Classes from Monday-Thursday. Students choose 1 course per block. Intensive format of 45 hours (3 credits). All students will be enrolled in an "Introduction to Spain" course.
